Words from our Branch Chairman ...

Having attended a number of funerals lately, both as a member of the congregation, and also in the role of organist, it has struck me how important the prior planning of liturgy and music is to the public remembrance of a person's life (and the commending of their soul to God's gracious keeping and protection).

Please prepare well in advance, if the form of the liturgy to be used is important to you and your loved ones. It is vital that you state clearly in a letter (that can be kept on file) to your Parish Priest which liturgy you desire at your funeral (hopefully the *BCP!*), and also specific musical selections (hymns, choral music, organ music, etc.).

These details must not be left to chance: grieving family members often do not have the time (or the inclination) to go looking for this information, and many times the wishes of the deceased are not honoured.

Remember, planning of this sort does not hasten the day, but can be a source of comfort knowing that your personal wishes will be honoured.

**“DAME JULIAN OF NORWICH”
POETRY COMPETITION 2014
TERMS OF REFERENCE**

This poetry competition is sponsored by the Prayer Book Society of Canada, Ottawa Branch, with the intention of celebrating and studying some of the glorious literature of the Christian heritage.

Competition Prizes:

Provided that there are sufficient poems submitted of a suitable standard, the Ottawa Branch will award cash prizes of

\$500.00 - First Prize
\$300.00 - Second Prize
\$100.00 - Third Prize

Requirements of Candidates:

The Competition is open to all Canadians, of any age. Candidates need not be resident in Canada.

Poetry Topic:

Poems, to be of a fairly substantial nature in any poetical format, are to be founded on and perhaps inspired by the work of Dame Julian of Norwich, generally known as *The Revelation of Divine Love in Sixteen Showings*. (Any standard edition may be used for research.) It is expected that each poem will make reference to at least three of the *Showings* described in Dame Julian’s work. For instance, here are three possible statements from the *Showings* which might be used as the basis for a poem:

And with this insight He also showed me a little thing, the size of a hazelnut, lying in the palm of my hand. . . . I looked at it with the eyes of my understanding, and thought “What can this be?” My question was answered in this fashion: “It is everything that is made. . . . It lasts, and ever shall last, because God loves it. And in this fashion all things have their being, by the grace of God.”

(The First Showing, Chapter 5)

The continual seeking of the soul for God pleases Him greatly. For the soul may do no more than seek, suffer, and trust, and this disposition is wrought in the soul that has it by the Holy Spirit. . . . The seeking of Him with faith pleases our Lord; the finding of Him pleases the soul and completely fills it with joy.

(The Second Showing, Chapter 10)

Our Lord said . . . “I am the ground of your beseeching. First, it is my will that you have what you ask, and then, I make you will it. Since I make you ask it, and you do ask it, how should it, then, be that you should not have what you ask?”

(The Fourteenth Showing, Chapter 41)

The poem itself must contain no evidence of the author's identity. In a covering letter or e-mail cover page, candidates must state their name, mailing address, and phone number, and their e-mail address if they have one. The **closing date** for receipt of applications is **March 31, 2014**.

Assessment of Applications:

Essays will be reviewed by a jury made up of a combination of three Canadian Anglican theologians and poets. Judgement will be based on the beauty of the poem, the poetical technique of its composition, and reference to the topic. The determination of the judges need not be unanimous. The decision of the judges will be final, and no poems will be returned, or commented upon directly. All candidates will be informed of the results of the jury's deliberations. If an insufficient number of suitable poems are submitted, it is possible that not all prizes may be awarded.

Award:

The awarding of the prizes to the successful candidates will be made by June 30, 2014, by the Prayer Book Society of Canada, Ottawa Branch.

The winning poems may be posted on the Society's website or published in the Society's Newsletters.

The 33rd Annual Atlantic Theological Conference

This year's Conference, entitled "*The Biblical Job: Comfort, Righteousness, Holiness*", will be held at Christ Church Cathedral, in Fredericton, N.B., from **Sunday, June 23rd to Wednesday, June 26th**.

Speakers will include The Rev. Dr Thomas Curran (Associate Professor and Associate Director, Foundation Year Programme at King's College, Halifax), Fr Christopher Snook (Rector of St Luke's, Regina), Dr Danielle Layne (Assistant Professor of Literature and Philosophy at Georgia Southern University), Dr Neil Robertson (Associate Professor of Humanities and Social Sciences at King's College, Halifax), and The Rev. Dr Lisa Wang (St James Cathedral, and Faculty of Divinity at Trinity College, Toronto). Papers will include such topics as "Job in the Enlightenment", "The Book of Job: a Literary history", and "Job and Holiness".
