35th Annual Atlantic Theological Conference

The following reflections and comments are provided by The Rev. Dr Ron. Hunt, one of last year's Conference Delegates from the Ottawa area.

The 2015 Atlantic Theological Conference took place last year at St. Peter's Cathedral in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, from Sunday, June 21 to the following Wednesday. The ATC was founded in 1981 to bring together people from all walks of life to hear papers and participate in discussions on issues of enduring and current theological importance. The theme of the Conference was "*The Outward Sense of Befriending*" : *The Beautiful, the True and the Good.*" The format allowed for the concepts of beauty, truth and goodness to be explored in the context of various eras of history, such as the Ancient World, Late Antiquity and the Middle Ages, the High Middle Ages, the Renaissance and the Reformation period, the Baroque, Romantic and Modern periods.

Five major papers were presented with responses and group discussion on the following topics:

"Can goodness and truth make us beautiful?: Perspectives on beauty in current Greek thought" by Fr. Snook, Rector, St. Georges (Round) Church, Halifax;

"Sense Perception and Divine Harmony: The meditating muse in Boethius' Consolation" by Dr. Stephen Blackwood, President, Ralston College, Savannah, Georgia;

"Beauty, Truth and Goodness as understood in the High Middle Ages" by Dr. Anthony Esolen, Professor of English, Providence College, Providence, Rhode Island;

"Beauty, Truth and Goodness in the Renaissance and Reformation" by the Hon. Justice Peter Bryson, QC, Judge of the Nova Scotia Court of Appeal, and

"Romantic Contemplation: S.T. Coleridge and his legacy" by Dr. Douglas Hedley, Reader in Hermeneutics and Metaphysics, Clare College, Cambridge University, England.

The annual Conference Eucharist, at which the Rector, Fr David Garrett preached, was held at the Cathedral on the Tuesday evening. It was followed by a wonderful lobster dinner with all the trimmings enjoyed by everyone. As usual, the spirit of Fr Robert Crouse, who died in 2011, and who was one of the co-founders of the Conference, rested on the proceedings.

FROM THE TREASURER

I want to thank you all for the tremendous support you gave the Branch after I wrote in the last Newsletter, along with the mailing about the Calendars, that the Branch was going through difficult financial times. Having spent so much money in the last three years on first the Essay Contest and then the Poetry Contest, we were finding our funds to be very depleted.

But when I told you in October that we unfortunately had very little money left in the bank, you responded terrifically and sent in nearly \$4,000 in the last two months of the year in tax-receiptable donations! I am so grateful for this very concrete support of our programme and activities, and we are now back in business again.

In 2015, we made our usual donations of \$500 to the St. Michael's Youth Conference, \$700 to assist clergy attending the annual Atlantic Theological Conference, and \$500 towards the cost of the National Newsletter. We also gave new BCP's to the students attending Augustine College this academic year, and in addition we published our three regular Branch Newsletters. Encouraged by a donation from Fr Ron Hunt, we gave \$250 to the cost of Anglican teenagers going to Iqaluit in the summer of 2016.

And after doing all this, with the help of your generous donations, we in fact finished the year with \$3,398.36 in the bank! That means we can carry on with our normal activities for 2016, and plan our programme properly. I am most grateful to all of you who continue to support the work of the Branch through financial donations. Your support is always appreciated, and all contributions are fully tax-receiptable.

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the *Prayer Book Society of Canada* will be held in the Fred Allen Memorial Hall at the Church of St Barnabas, Apostle and Martyr, Ottawa.

On behalf of the Ottawa Branch Executive, members are both invited and encouraged to attend this important Meeting of the National part of the Society. It is not yet known how many members from across the country will be able to attend. The Society's Constitution requires a quorum of twenty-five (25) members be in attendance for the National AGM. Please mark your calendars and plan to be present as it will be the members of our Branch who will inevitably make up the required quorum.

We are pleased to announce that the Guest Speaker at the AGM will be the Retired Bishop of the Diocese of Ottawa, and soon-to-be retired Anglican Bishop Ordinary to the Canadian Armed Forces, The Rt. Rev. Peter R. Coffin. Bishop Coffin has very kindly agreed to be with us during his busy schedule prior to his retirement. He plans on following a similar theme to the presentation he made at Christ Church, Bells Corners in June 2014 when he discussed how the Prayer Book has been used by military chaplains in time of war and peace; those who missed that wonderful presentation will have a chance to enjoy part of it now. A short reception will follow the AGM at which you will be able to visit with the Bishop, members of the National Council, and other members of the Society.

The AGM will be followed by Choral Evensong in the church at 4:00 p.m. It is hoped that members of the parish choir will sing the service.
