Saturday, March 15th - - - - 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Fr Koester has chosen "Praying with Jesus" as the topic for a *Lenten Quiet Day*, to be held at St Barnabas, Ottawa. Fr will take a few key words such as 'Our', 'Come', 'Give', and 'Forgive' from the Lord's Prayer and do a series of meditations on them. The day will begin with Morning Prayer at 9:00 a.m. and will end with Evening Prayer at 3:00 p.m. Although homemade soup will be provided for lunch, you are invited to bring a small bag lunch if you wish. Members are encouraged to attend this Quiet Day being held during mid-Lent.

Of interest too will be Fr Koester's presentation the previous evening (Friday) entitled "Monastic Wisdom for Everyday Living" in which he will take a number of themes such as the vows and suggest ways that they could be lived out in the everyday world. This will begin about 7:30 p.m. following Stations of the Cross.

Fr Koester will finish off his visit by preaching at the 10:30 High Mass on Lent II (March 16th).

Advent and Lenten Quiet Days have traditionally been popular times of reflection and contemplation. Those who have attended the Quiet Days appreciate and benefit by the time spent. The Lenten Quiet Days form an excellent means of preparation for Easter. "The Book of Common Prayer - 'A Reasonable, Religious and Holy Hope' in War and Peace"

Plan to attend a talk to be given by **The Right Rev. Peter Coffin**, retired Bishop of the Diocese and now Anglican Bishop Ordinary to the Canadian Forces. Bishop Coffin intends to show us how the Prayer Book was used extensively by the Church of England during WWII. He will also discuss the part hymns played during wartime and how they helped the troops. Frances Macdonnell will direct the Cranmer Singers as they assist in the presentation. We anticipate seeing a number of vintage photographs (e.g. a WWII chaplain leading prayers on a landing craft at D Day and another at a grave site - both using *BCP*s).

I am glad to report that we wound up the 2013 calendar year in a positive state with a bank balance of \$2,401.36, which is entirely thanks to the generous donations many of our members sent in at the end of 2013 - thank you all very much! We were able to make our usual donations of \$500 to the Cranmer Conference, \$500 to the St. Michael's Youth Camp, and \$700 to clergy attending the annual Atlantic Theological Conference. We also donated money for the purchase of new BCP's for St. Barnabas Church, Ottawa, and for the students attending Augustine College, as well as publishing our usual Branch Newsletters and contributing towards the cost of the National Newsletter.

As you know, the Branch is now offering a Poetry Competition, aimed at encouraging participation by all Canadians. Even though the Poetry Contest does not end until March 31, we have already received eleven applications, and we have had quite a few more enquiries. Our ad in the Anglican Planet for the Poetry Contest has attracted a lot of attention. Prizes are being offered in the amounts of \$500, \$300, and \$100.
