



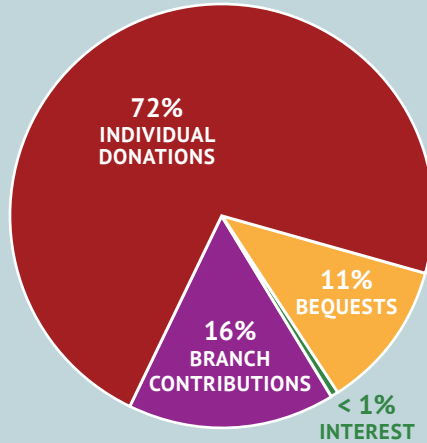

## WHERE OUR REVENUES COME FROM

### REVENUE SOURCE AVERAGES OVER THE PAST FIVE YEARS

- Individual Donations: \$44,521
- Bequests: \$6,965
- Interest: \$464
- Branch Contributions: \$9,570

Note: As of May 2024, the accounts are in a positive position, due to an unusually large sum received in 2023 which resulted from a branch closure.

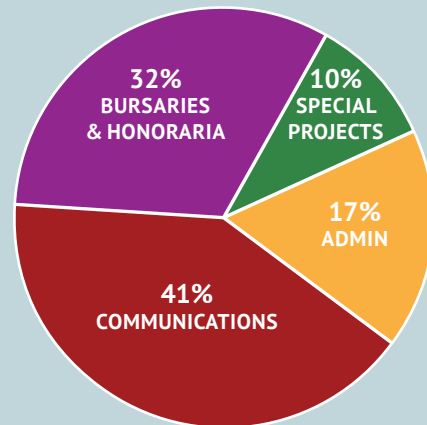


As we continue to shift to a model that relies less on 'branches' and more on connecting directly with friends and members, our revenues from branches will continue to decrease, making individual donations and bequests increasingly important in the work we do.

## IN TERMS OF MINISTRY: WHERE OUR REVENUES GO

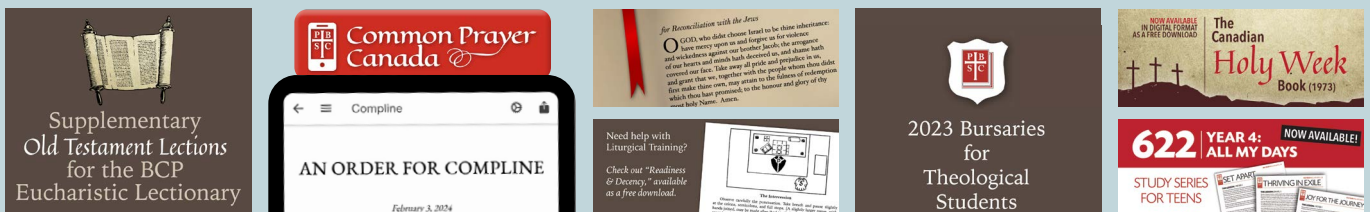
### 2023 EXPENSE BREAKDOWN BY CATEGORY

- Communications: \$24,153 newsletters, website, etc.
- Administration: \$11,708 bookkeeping, professional fees, etc.
- Special Projects: \$5,400 CPC app development, facebook
- Bursaries & Honoraria: \$18,787 Divinity students, PBSC chair



As you can see, our operating costs are modest. What the pie chart doesn't show is the overwhelming number of volunteer hours that contribute to managing projects, writing newsletter content and overseeing operations. In spite of this, revenues are lower than needed to maintain our current ministry level.

## IN TERMS OF MINISTRY: RECENT & ONGOING PROJECTS



The projects that have always been central to the PBSC's mission continue – such as annual bursaries for theological and divinity students, the donation of prayer books, and offering talks and essays about the Book of Common Prayer.

In recent years, the PBSC has worked with Synod on a prayer for Reconciliation with the Jewish People, and has published online resources including the 1973 Holy Week book, "Readiness & Decency", and a four-year curriculum series for teens.

Currently two special projects are underway: the development of Old Testament lections for the BCP Eucharistic Lectionary, and the continued expansion of our much acclaimed Common Prayer Canada app.
